PROBLEM STATEMENT

Primary care is the backbone of our health care system, and is an essential element in our efforts in health care reform. Our primary care system, though, is only as strong as the healthcare teams that help diagnose and treat those in need of care.

Collaboration across disciplines is always challenging. While medicine and pharmacy are highly collaborative in inpatient environments, there has been comparatively little attention paid to integration of primary care and pharmacy in outpatient settings. Considering the high volume of medications prescribed in primary care, we have tremendous opportunity to expand the ways in which primary care clinicians and pharmacists can collaborate.

The goal of this conference is to explore ways in which medical professionals and pharmacists can better collaborate to achieve the *Institute for Healthcare Improvement Triple Aim* of improving quality of care, improving patient satisfaction with care, and controlling health care costs. We will be hearing from experts who have been on the front lines of innovation in primary care and pharmacy.
